Short description


The purpose of exchange/trip was to participate on Springboard Dance Montreal (http://www.springboarddansemontreal.com) as one of the emerging choreographers. There were 7 emerging choreographers who passed though the selection process and I had the privilege

There were 7 emerging choreographers who passed though the selection process and I had the privilege to be chosen and to work on developing my choreography skills for 3 weeks with dancers from over the world.

Week 1: Auditioning and Meeting

The program consisted of 120 dancers/participants and all emerging choreographers host together an audition process in order to select dancers to work with.

I have selected 19 dancers in the end.



The audition took place at Les Grands Ballets. (http://www.grandsballets.com) where I also rehearsed my choreography for the period of 3 weeks. I was able to use the studio for 5 days every week.

Place des Arts (http://placedesarts.com/index.en.html) is a major performing arts centre in Montreal, home theater to Les Grands Ballets, and it is also the place where the showing of my choreography took place at the end of week 3.

At the end of the 1st week, I had chance to present my self at Place des Arts as part of Springboard Danse Montreal Emerging Choreographers Platform.




Week 2: Rehearsing and Thinking

Beside the emerging choreographers, there were several dance companies/choreographers from North America and Europe teaching their repertoire to the dancers.

I had chance to watch their rehearsal and the opportunity to have a good insight of how other choreographers work in the studio and learn what is going on in the dance scene in North America. The participants were Johannes Wieland (Kassel), RUBBERBANDance (Montreal), Fernando Melo (Göteborg), Maxine Doyle (UK), Kidd Pivot (Vancouver), VIM VIGOR (New York City), Le Carré des Lombes (Montreal), Ohad Naharin (Tel Aviv), Rosas (Brussels), Roy Assaf (Israel).

During week 2, I have developed the idea for my choreography which was inspired by the work of Steve Reich. I tired to transcribe what Reich did in his music composition into dance language. I made a score for the choreography in order to explain to the dancers what I was aiming to do.




Above is a part of the score which explains how the choreography was constructed.

Beside Steve Reich, another inspiration for the choreography was the work of visual artist Lee Ufan.


His work influenced how I create the score as well as the composition for the choreography.
